#### **SITUATION VACANT**

Nominations are invited from Members of Syston Bowling Club for the post of CHAIRMAN, BOARD OF DIRECTORS with effect from Monday 16th March 2015.

Nominees (male or female) should, ideally, have some previous experience of Club committee work at either Section or Board level.

The successful candidate must possess and be committed to a strategy for the practical short- and long-term development of the Club allied to strong communication skills to ensure that Members are kept fully informed of Board activities and that effective representations of any concerns expressed by Members are made to the appropriate external agencies.

The Chairman acts as the figurehead and focal point for the Club within the local community through a programme of appropriate and relevant Press Releases, representative attendance at civic functions, establishing links with other community groups and, where appropriate, with local businesses.

The Chairman has no more authority or power than any other Member of the Club and is at all times subject to the wishes of the membership as expressed through representative Directors serving on the Board. However, in appropriate circumstances, the Chairman may take executive decisions on pressing matters which arise between meetings of the Board in order to ensure the continued smooth operation of the Club on a day-to-day basis. Any such decisions must be subsequently reported to the Board for retrospective approval.

The Chairman's main task is to chair all meetings of the Board in a manner and style which ensures effective coverage of

the agreed Agenda, allowing all Directors full opportunity to express their views thereby achieving democratic decisions on all matters in accordance with the known or perceived wishes of the majority of Members. The Chairman supervises and actively supports the participation of all Directors in the day-to-day management of the Club by setting priorities and maximising their effectiveness by delegation of specific duties and responsibilities matching their individual skills and talents. Together with the Finance Director, the Chairman ensures the setting of and subsequent adherence to an annual operational budget for the Club in accordance with approved business plans.

At General Meetings of the Club - the Chairman should adopt a manner and style which ensures effective coverage of the Agenda allowing all Members full opportunity to express their views thereby achieving democratic decisions on all matters.

At the Annual General Meeting, on behalf of the Board, the Chairman presents an annual report, summarising the activities of the Board over the previous year, enabling Members to comment and to provide effective guidance to the Board in their management of the Club during the following year.

In addition to vision and strong communication skills, a good Chairman should possess the patience of Job, broad shoulders, a thick skin, an even temperament, the ability to absorb, assess and respond to criticism, strong diplomatic and arbitration skills, a sense of humour, an open mind, energy and enthusiasm, determination and, above all, a clear commitment to and focus on the continuing development of the Club and the interests of its membership.
