On the 17th September 1973, Albert Vesty, the County President (Western Park BC) brought a Representative County team to play an afternoon match with Syston to commemorate the 21st Anniversary Year.

Frank Needham, a founder member of the club was the Syston President at that time.

Top tips to help keep you on the road:

- Check tyre tread and screen wash levels before you set off, and always ensure windows, mirrors and roofs are clear.
- Only accelerate gently use low revs and change into a higher gear as soon as possible to help reduce wheel slip.
- Leave a gap between you and the car in front ten times greater than normal.
- Steer, brake and make gear changes smoothly and slowly, so allow more time for your journey.
- Don't leave accessories on charge overnight, such as phone chargers or iPods.



BACK TO BASICS

SATURDAY 17th

JANUARY 2015

Remember the basics of bowls when you are not playing very well.

To have that prefect draw you have to practice the routine.

1. Bias and grip.

2. Step onto the mat facing down the line to the shoulder.

3. When taking your stance on the mat point your right foot at the aiming point. At the point of delivery the right foot, elbow, wrist and the bowl, the aiming point should all be in a straight line.

4. Full concentration when delivery of the bowl, thinking about the weight right up to when the bowl leaves your hand.

Length: Adjust the following to suit the pace of the green. (a) Height or stance. (b) Length of back swing (c) Forward of body weight. (d) Speed of delivery. (e) Pressure of the grip before delivering "weigh"the bowl in the hand to get full concentration of the distance it has to travel (for outdoor and indoor bowls). The above is for outdoor bowls. Indoor bowls the pace of the green is much faster.

The arc to the jack is much wider and that the bowl will need to travel on part of the adjoining rink if it is to finish on the jack.

Because of the faster pace of the indoor green, greater control in delivery is needed indoors.

I think I have already wrote the following in this Newsletter, but I think it is worth repeating.

The jack is sometimes called the kitty. and was uttered by a lady.

When my husband took up bowling he boasted on the phone about a girl called Kitty with whom he could not leave alone. He addressed her, caressed her, by her he seemed bewitched. He missed her, he kissed her, stayed with her in the ditch.

So I took up bowling to win my husband back and found what he could do with Kitty I could do with Jack!

In the October *Syston Green*, I forgot to write about when a No.3 says that his rink has 2 or more shots, he can if he measures for them.
