#### . PRESIDENT'S MEDAL



The Board are considering commissioning a new, top-quality, President's medal to replace the existing separate Men's and Ladies' versions and to reflect the new unified status of the Club and the high status of the office of President.

After a deal of market research, an acceptable design specification has been agreed and a competitive quote for production received.

"Metal and hard enamelled pendant and top bar. Top bar rectangular shape size 30mm x 13mm plus bottom ring and staple on reverse. Enamelled one colour (green) and worded PRESIDENT. Pendant circular shape size 39mm diameter plus top ring, enamelled three colours (green, maroon and white), polished gilt highlights, matt recessed background and attached to 32mm wide Maroon ribbon. Packed in presentation case. Cost: £529.50"

Strong efforts to find sponsorship have resulted in a single pledge of £250. As a next step, the Board have decided to offer Club Members the chance to contribute to the balance, enabling us to purchase something that will not only become part of the Club's heritage but which, at the same time, signals the membership's appreciation and acknowledgement of the hard work and commitment of those who volunteer their services to act as our President over the coming years.

#### **MEMBERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES**

"The world is full of willing people. Those willing to work and those willing to let them!"

In keeping with this adage, the Board are concerned to receive repeated reports of a general lack of support from the wider membership for the extensive range of tasks that are necessary for the maintenance and development of the clubhouse and green.

Appeals for help in maintaining the green surrounds fall largely on deaf ears with the same small minority of Members being left to shoulder the burden. Similarly, the range of tasks involved in maintaining clubhouse facilities are ignored by the majority and left to the same small group of "activists".

In addition, it is clear that there are Members who regularly fail to help with such simple tasks as bringing in all green equipment following a game. Once a game is over, far too many Members simply walk off to the clubhouse without helping to return pushers, mats, jacks, rink markers etc to the rear store.

Every single Member should take pride in the quality of our fine Club. Every individual should be prepared to play a part in sharing the responsibility for the upkeep of all of our facilities on and off the green.

To paraphrase the famous words of JFK at his inauguration, "Ask not what your Club can do for you but, rather,

what can I do for the Club. While offering sincere thanks to those who do respond so regularly to calls for help and those who do take their responsibilities seriously, we appeal to all of those whose contribution and commitment falls short of the ideal to resolve to do much better in future.

#### **CAR PARKING**

There is strong evidence to suggest that the benefits of our hard-won parking facilities close to the clubhouse are not being fully exploited. While some responsibility lies with visiting Clubs, players remaining ignorant of the change as a result of their Officers not passing on the message, we must bear some of the responsibility ourselves.

Visiting players will obviously become increasingly aware of the new arrangements as a result of their visits in the current Season – provided, at least, that Captains of the day regularly point out the improvement to them in their post-meal welcome speeches. For the current Season's fixture programme, Captains should take the opportunity to remind visiting Captains of the availability of parking when they consult about the number of rinks, start times etc. in the days prior to each game, urging them to pass on the information to selected players.

Captains should also ensure that the specified conditions covering parking are closely adhered to. Two parking marshals should be designated for every weekday game – including evening fixtures. Sadly, there is little evidence that this is happening at the present time.

It should be obvious to all that unless we can demonstrate that the facility is being used – and used in accordance with the conditions attached – we are in danger of having the privilege cancelled.

#### **CLUB HONOURED WITH OFFER OF 2019 COUNTY MATCH**

The Club has been honoured to receive and accept an offer from Bowls Leicestershire to hold a County game against Herefordshire on Tuesday 30th July 2019.

County Match Secretary, Alan Bray, said that, in making the offer, he was responding to the many highly complimentary reports he had received about the high quality of the playing surface at Syston.

It is anticipated that some improvements to the green surrounds – such as the cutting back of hedges on the St Peters Street and Central Park ends of the green, to allow standing space behind the ditches - will have to be made in anticipation of a County match. We will also have to negotiate with the Town Council to be in a position to provide some extraordinary, once-off parking arrangements for the occasion.



#### **Gardening Group News from Chris Dodge**

Herbaceous and mixed borders can begin to look a little dull and jaded at this time of year. The main flush of colour is likely to be over and, if the weather has been dry, the plants will probably begin to lack vitality.

If there are no restraints on watering, spend half an hour or so giving the plants a good soak. If you use a 'Miracle-Gro' feeder or the fine rose on your watering can you can give all the

plants a feed at the same time. The best time to do this is in the evening when the sun has lost most of its heat, (in any case do not water the leaves of plants in direct hot sunshine) by watering at this time of the day it also gives the water a chance to get down to the roots before it has evaporated.

This will make the border look green and fresh again, and can be invaluable for later flowering plants and shrubs, giving them a boost.

Weed the beds and borders, before watering, give them a thorough once over with a hoe or weed by hand, if you use the hoe when the soil is dry, it cuts them off and they are less likely to re-root themselves, but try to wait a day or so to make sure the weeds wither and die first, or collect them up before watering.

If time or water shortages limit the amount of water that you can do in the garden, always give priority to the plants you are growing in containers. Hanging baskets will need abundant watering at this time - twice a day is not too often in very hot weather. More failures are due to water shortage than any other reason. Some plants like geraniums (pelargoniums) will tolerate a degree of neglect if they have to, others such as lobelia can be ruined if you let the container dry out for a single day.

Whilst talking about hanging baskets and containers, don't forget to dead head your flowers regularly or you will loose the continuity of a long flowering period.

One more thing, after all this work on your garden get your deckchair out and just sit and enjoy the fruits of your labours, perhaps with a nice cup of tea or maybe a Gin and tonic.
