I am getting in touch with local Parish contacts to share information regarding our Warm Homes Fund scheme within Public Health at Leicestershire County Council. <u>www.leicestershire.gov.uk/warm-homes-fund</u>

Our Warm Homes service is keen to promote the scheme delivered in partnership with E.ON and Age UK Leicester, Shire & Rutland which supports lower income households to receive fully funded connections to gas and first time central heating installation to support affordable warmth. The project aims to deliver 500 installations primarily to private sector owner-occupiers and tenants and runs until Spring 2022.

As we head into warmer weather and progress cautiously through the roadmap in easing of lockdown restrictions, the summer months when many will have their main heating turned off will be an appropriate time for many to consider this offer when it causes minimal disruption.

Naturally this offer may not be relevant to every parish, particularly in some rural areas where it has typically not been viable to extend the gas network into the area.

The nongasmap tool was developed to support projects in identification of areas containing properties within a viable distance of gas (typically within 23 metres for individual household applications and 50m where a community scheme might connect larger numbers of properties on a street or estate). This may help in determining if this is a relevant opportunity rural Parishes wish to promote locally:

In addition to welcoming applications from across the county, the Warm Homes Fund also aims to target support to areas of higher deprivation. Over the coming months our service will be looking to send out targeted communications to private sector households within the following LSOAs identified as being within the 25% most deprived Index of Multiple Deprivation measure. Households within these areas will also be able to qualify for support based on a household savings threshold in addition to the low income criteria published online.

I want to make a couple of points before we start the season

There are many benefits to artificial grass including lower maintenance and not worrying about watering, fertiliser, weeds, diseases, and insects. It does have risks of wear from high traffic and weather if not properly cared for.

To keep artificial turf looking great and increase longevity we've gathered some best practices for taking care of the grass.

- 1. For mild stains promptly clean with a mixture of water and household detergent. For tougher stains you can use a 3% solution of ammonia in water. Rinse the cleaner out thoroughly with cool water.
- 2. For items that may get stuck to the material like tree sap or gum, use dry ice or aerosol refrigerant to freeze then scrape off.
- 3. For pet waste allow solids to dry before removing them. For liquid waste rinse with cool water.
- 4. Monthly if not weekly maintenance includes clearing debris, rinsing, and cross brushing against the grain.

Gardening Tips for Spring

This week we've gathered all our pro tips for giving your garden its best start to spring.

- **Prune Perennials** clip dead leaves and grasses from daylilies, Hosta's, ornamental grasses, cornflowers, sedum
- **Compost** Remove last season's dead annuals and add these to your compost pile
- **Refresh Mulch** remove any winter protection items like burlap wraps, rose cones and windscreens, remove dead leaves and debris and add new mulch around plants
- Spring Lawn Raking raking can help remove dead leaves and grass as well as loosen matted grass clumps pro tip: avoid raking when the ground is wet otherwise you risk pulling up new growth from the soft soil
- Prune Spring-Blooming Trees and Shrubs Accordingly to type
- **Pull out the Weeds** remove weeds before they get unruly and cover soil with a thick layer of mulch to prevent more from growing
- Fertilise Evergreens if soil is healthy and rich evergreens only require fertilisation every other year
- Edge Garden Beds removing invading grass by edging your beds creates a clean polished look and prevents grass from crawling into your bed and overgrowing planting
