SINCERE thanks are offered to all those who turned up to the Joint Club AGM on Monday 17th March to offer unanimous support to the Board's proposals for the re-structuring of the Club to enable us to deal more effectively with the current pressures for an extension to our Clubhouse facilities.

"Thank vou!" also to the nine Members whose offer to serve as Directors of the Club for another year was also unanimously supported. Following the vote in favour of the new "Constitution" for the Club, they automatically became the first Directors of the new Syston Bowling Club, within which the Syston Men's Bowling Club and Syston Ladies' Bowling Club will continue to operate as usual.

Club Chairman, Colin Grimes, says:

"As explained to Members at the AGM, the task of taking full advantage of the ordinary Member will not be aware of any changes in the way in which the Club is presents. We would hope to have some organised and managed on a daily basis. detailed proposals for expansion to our Both Sections of the Club will continue as before. The new structure gives the Board the necessary powers to take advantage of the many possibilities for grant aid for our development plans and qualifies us to apply for recognition by the Inland Revenue as a Community Amateur Sports Club (CASC). This should enable us to achieve a significant increase in annual revenue without the need to increase membership subscriptions.

As those at the AGM learned, the Club will need to increase revenues if we are to maintain current levels of expenditure. We incurred a planned deficit last year and are budgeting for another deficit in the current year. Cash reserves enable us to make these plans withour threatening the viability of the Club - in the short-term - but clearly we cannot sustain such losses over a longer period. It was most reassuring to find that we had the unanimous support of the membership for our plans.

The Board will now begin the challenging opportunities which our new status changing room facilities before the end of the coming Season and to start applying for grants from various sources, in the hope that any construction work can be undertaken in the Close Season.

We will do everything in our power to justify the confidence which the membership has shown in us."
