That visit literally changed my life as I was immediately welcomed into the club and found to my surprise that I loved the great game of bowls, and found comradeship that I have never had before. Thank you to all of you, as I now consider all of you as my friends, never before have I enjoyed the companionship of so many friends.

Each new President has left his mark on the club and during the last two years particularly, thanks firstly to Colin Grimes and recently to Pete

Murray, the club has gone from strength to strength, not only achieving great bowling results because of all the work **Des Eggitt** contributes, and the team building efforts that the Club Captains (*Myles, George, Dave, and Brian*) put into the selection of our teams. but also in the way so many members now get together for socials, coffee mornings, aarden aroup activities, fund-raising, etc.

I want to continue the good work and will do my best to uphold, maintain and promote the good name, standards and reputation built up over many years of Syston Bowling Club. President's Charity.

Most Presidents have a chosen charity. This President is going to be slightly different. I'm going to sponsor two charities. My first charity is VISTA - a charity for the blind and partially sighted, based in Leicester, and is specifically for Leicestershire and Rutland people. Secondly, I am asking for support for Inter Care - a charity based in Syston which collects unwanted prescribed drugs, sorts them, then sends them to clinical centres in Africa. Both of these charities have representatives whose job it is to encourage sponsorships, and both will be invited to one of our coffee mornings to introduce their respective charities. I do hope you will attend their talks so that you may appreciate more the way they operate.

I know that charity should begin at home and our club needs more money, but when you see the needs of others who are in situations which are out of their control and need the help of other people. I'm sure you will give your support to them. VISTA will want your money, Inter care want your unwanted prescribed drugs, and used postage stamps.

Something different - A trophy you don't have to compete for.

Ever since I started bowling, I thought, that, if you got chalk on your wood, you should get something, some sort of reward for being so accurate, (or so lucky). So, in the spirit of fun, as well as promoting accuracy in our bowling, I have devised a system of recording the "touchers". At great expense, I've purchased a stamp to imprint on the back of the score cards, a device where the Number 2 can record, when a player has a "toucher". I know this puts another iob on to the Number 2, but it will be only a small pencil mark.

The back of each card is to be marked out with numbers 1 to 3 and S, with accompanying squares. The idea is that when a player gets a "toucher", Number 2 puts a mark in the appropriate square. (The player concerned can "encourage" Number 2, to make sure he does so!) The Captains and I will keep a record through the season on a prepared list, so that at the end of the season a trophy will be presented to the player who has the most "touchers" throughout the season.

Bringing back fines.

I thought that, when some past Presidents, introduced fines for some small error of judgment, this added a bit more fun into the game and also aided the coffers of their charities. I therefore give warning that I plan to bring back the fines for such things as wrong bias, bowls with the wrong stickers, or no stickers at all, swearing on the green, infringement of the Dress Code and so on - all in the name of fun, of course.

And finally

I know you will all support me in my efforts to be a good President and wish you all a happy and fun filled 2011 season.



BACK TO BASICS is this month's theme.

- 1. Make sure that you're gripping your bowl correctly. A wobbling bowl cannot be consistently accurate.
- 2. Make sure that you are facing the "shoulder" of the arc of the hand you wish to play with your whole body.
- 3. Remember to be perfectly balanced and relaxed, with knees slightly bent if you are to bowl from the athletic position.
- 4. through with your delivery - from the hand which delivers the bowl to the back foot that lifts gently off the mat without any jerking or measure of stiffness in any part of the flow.
- 5. Having estimated weight by looking at the jack, keep your eves firmly fixed on the shoulder of the intended arc when delivering the bowl.
- Keep your head down until after the 6. bowl has been released from your hand.
- 7. Remember that there is a perfect weight and green combination for every shot attempted and nothing gives more satisfaction than when you achieve it.
- Always be positive when you step on 8. the mat and be confident and sure of the shot to be attempted.
- **9.** When playing in pairs, triples or fours, always remember that it is a team game with only one Skip - only one person in command.
- **10.** Mould your play to your Skip's wishes remembering that four players playing their own game, no matter how good they are as individuals, will never make a truly successful side.
