The Club Coach Column

Back to Basics No 6

- Some players hold a "preference" at bowls - preferring to play on a particular hand because they are conscious of a weakness on the other hand.
 - Check up regularly on your weaknesses and work to eradicate them, either with your Club Coach or during informal roll-ups.
- Most of our fears about an opponent or his/her prowess - real or imaginary - will vanish if we tell ourselves that we can't be reprimanded for losing. Never dwell upon or anticipate defeat.
- "Face, shoulders, hips, knees. Face
 of the wood, bias side, grip and
 position of four fingers and thumb."
 Apply this simple pre-check to all
 your draw shots to make everything
 streamlined.
- 4. An open mind is a balanced mind. Don't close your eyes to your weaknesses but go after them when someone points them out to you.
- 5. Silence begets good length. Talk a lot and you'll soon lose it. Make it clear to your fellow players if you don't want to talk at any particular point; it can always be done diplomatically.
