The Club Coach Column

1. Advice to Skips

- All members of a rink, playing to support each other and not simply for their own game, must play to the Skip's instructions.
- A Skip must make sure that the bowler on the mat knows exactly what is required from a particular shot (i.e. hand, line into the head and weight) in order to optimise the chances of success.
- A Skip should **not** be one who relies on firing whenever the rink is "down".
 A firing shot is "hit or miss" and, more often than not, fails to achieve its objective.
- 4. A Skip must be able to play all of the shots. Make use of roll-ups to practice the whole range of shots but remember, always, the "bread and butter" shot is always the perfect drawing shot.
- As Skip, never underestimate the potential of Lead and Second to help to win matches.

2. General guidance for all

- 1. In a fours match at Leicester IBC we were 18 shots to 8 down with five ends to go. Their front players were consistently outbowling our own front two. Then our Lead began to find a rhythm and we won the remaining ends by 1, 2, 2, 2 and 5 making the final score 18-20 in our favour. So, remember the game is never lost until the final wood is delivered.
- Also remember always to be positive not negative and never think that you can't play a particular shot. A good attempt is always better than a faint hearted (usually poor) delivery.

I wish everyone good health and offer my best wishes for a successful and enjoyable outdoor Season.

Chris Biddles reflects

IAM sure that we all look forward to the monthly editions of "Syston" Green". Our thanks go to Colin and George for producing these. I know that sometimes they have difficulty in filling the pages and I would encourage anyone who has any interesting news or forthcoming events to contact them with the details.

Many years ago, Mr Eric Roberts (now deceased) a Member of the Men's Section, also used to produce a monthly Newsletter. I have retained some items that I found interesting among which I discovered the following contribution by Mrs Mavis Sanderson (also now deceased) a Past Life Member and Ladies' President:



"Our Badge



I am very proud of our badge I suppose because in 1964 I helped to design it. Until then, we didn't have one to wear on our white blazers. Members who belonged to the Townswomen's Guild had just taken part in a "Syston This is Your Life" and, going through old records. discovered why they called the bridge that spans the brook on Melton Road "The Nine Day Wonder" bridge. We discovered that it had been built in nine days. We also discovered how many bricks had been used.

That then became the main theme of our badge. I think that Kath Chapman drew it up, the view taken being roughly that seen looking back towards Melton Road from the Working Men's Club.

The two coats of arms belong to the Patron Saints St Peter and St Paul. The yellow was incorporated into our hatband to freshen it up as it had been blue and white. When you have been involved in something that is a symbol of the Club, you will realise why I say I am proud of our badge.

The Men's badge incorporates the Syston White plum tree which is now almost extinct. There were some very good Syston Plum trees in the grounds of the orchards belonging to the Payne family in Upper Church Street. Mr Payne was the village blacksmith."

Mr Payne was the grandfather of Doreen's late husband, Harry, and the old blacksmith's premises are now part of Forge Court.

Regarding the badge. I am very proud to own one of the originals which was given to me by Life Member and Past President Dorothy Drayco (deceased). I still have the letter enclosed with the badge saying that she would like me to have it.

The question of wearing Club badges has been raised many times. The County ruling used to be that you could not wear a Club badge on a blue County blazer. The rules have now been changed enabling you to wear your Club badge. However, if you are selected for a County game, then you must remove your Club badge.

Since the majority of Members now buy the blue County blazer, we can investigate the cost of the disc and price of the badges.
