accident two years ago. It has been a long and slow recovery with still a long way to go. Our best wishes go to all of the family.



## The Club Coach Column



1. Getting the best out of roll-ups

Bowling to the same length (long or short) during roll-ups does **NOT** help you to adjust to different lengths in competitive games.

How often in matches do you see players struggling to bowl to a short end or when the mat is taken up the green?

So, in roll-ups, don't kick the bowls to the end of the green but place the mat where the head finished. This will help in adjusting to and finding different lengths.

If you have any faults, the roll-up gives you the opportunity to eradicate them. Take advantage of the opportunities presented by roll-ups to address any weaknesses in your game.

(Please also remember that I'm always ready to offer you any help you might need to improve any aspect of your play.)

#### 2. Teamwork

Remember that, in competitive matches, the Skip must have teamwork from every member of the rink. All must be involved in deciding a vital shot to win a match. Each player may read the head in a different way - but the Skip must take the right shot. Quite often the head will have changed since the Skip was at the head making it impossible for him to read it from the mat. So, if No 3 gives him the right and positive guidance he must be prepared to listen and to play the shot as suggested in order to try to win the end or the match.

A good Skip will re-visit the head to discuss the situation with the No 3 if he is not convinced of the accuracy of the reading of the head or if the No 3 is unsure about what to advise.

If a Skip chooses to ignore guidance and/or not to listen simply on the grounds that "I'm in charge! It's my responsibility!" this is not teamwork.

No 3, whose sole responsibility it is to agree the score in each head with his opposite number, insisting on a measure if he has any doubts, also has a duty to the rest of the rink by ensuring that these responsibilities are thoroughly executed. While Lead and No 2 must not interfere with any

measuring process, if either of them clearly observes that a bowl has been wrongly identified or, perhaps, overlooked in the process, they have a duty to draw the error or omission to the attention of the No 3 in order to ensure an accurate score. On such fine details do the outcome of any match often depend.

**Kieran's** success makes me very proud as Club Coach and gives me a very satisfying feeling of reward for my efforts.
