# Company Patronage scheme launched

Board seek to find additional revenue streams by exploiting advertising potential

YOUR BOARD of Directors have been giving a deal of thought to ways of raising additional revenue in order to put the Club's finances on a sound footing. Now that we are responsible for the maintenance of the green, and remain committed to improving the quality of the playing surface, it is clear that current income levels are barely sufficient to cover the costs involved. We have managed, to date, by using modest reserves and by cutting back on other areas of expenditure such as building repairs and maintenance.

affecting many other Clubs in the County. The continuing success of coffee mornings and a very strong programme of social events throughout the Close Season have also played their part in helping to sustain a balanced budget.

How can we move forward to rebuild our cash reserves and reinstate a rolling programme of

repair and renovation of the clubhouse. while sustaining the higher levels of expenditure on the green to which we are now committed?

A further substantial increase in membership subscriptions would be the easiest but least attractive option. It is difficult to see how we can generate further surpluses from the Bar and from the social programme without significant increases in prices and entry fees - steps which would, in all likelihood, prove counter-productive.

Faced with these factors, the Board has sought to identify new and additional sources of income.


Fortunately, through membership growth, I As a first step, it has been agreed to exploit increases in subscriptions and careful the potential of the Newsletter, the web site management of the Bar (our primary and the area around the green for sources of income) we have avoided the advertising. Local companies, supplying

membership, to other readers of the Newsletter and to visitors to the web site, as well as to the wider local community who pass by the green, could benefit. Approaches are being made to a select number of local companies inviting them to become Patrons of the Club. In return for a modest annual fee.

each one will be offered a display advertisement in the Newsletter and on the web site (with a "hot link" to their own site. where such facility exists) and, for a maximum of 10 such Patrons, the opportunity to erect a 4ft x 2ft display board on the perimeter of the green during match days. (Permission for this service, on a trial basis, has already been granted by the Town Council.)

It is hoped that, in this way, we can raise up to £4000 per annum for Club funds - the equivalent of a £50 per head increase in membership subscriptions!

# This month, Des identifies the main causes of damaging negativity within the game situation

**THE** following list is not exhaustive. There are conditions of personal stress which can affect a player's powers of concentration. Whatever the cause, the trick is to be prepared and to have some system of control or prevention that can be brought into play to diminish the adverse effects of negativity. The most common sources of negative thinking are:

- Des Eggitt
  The Tear of failure
- \* Noise levels (especially indoors)
- \* Inadequate mental preparation
- \* Trying too hard to concentrate
- The behaviour of opponents
- \* Partisanship of any spectators working against you
- Recalling a previous situation when you played a similar shot with a poor result
- The fact that you (or your team) are well behind on the score card
- Doubts about the quality of the playing surface
- Inclement weather conditions such as rain, strong wind or heat
   Adverse conditions which have caused
- you to arrive late at the venue
