The Club Coach Column

This month, Des stresses the importance of trust between the Skip and Number 3 and of never giving up until the last wood is delivered



PLAYING the right shot and the match is never over till the last bowl. In a match of fours at Melton Indoors Bowls Centre, we were 14-3 shots down with 6 ends to play. After the next 2, with 2 to go, we had narrowed the gap to14-8. In such a situation, it is more important than usual that front end players should get shots into the head. Margaret Trigg and Colin Smith successfully drew one shot each and I managed to get a third leaving us needing four shots for a win on the last end.

Margaret and Colin again set us up with 2 shots. As I took the mat, we needed another shot to achieve a draw and 2 shots to win the

match.

The situation of the head was that we had two good shots hiding the jack which was some 6ins behind. I could not see the jack from the mat.

Clearly, my only option was to draw. On the forehand, the opposition had a bowl a yard short in the draw, but I played through it and got a third shot.

Not being able to read the head from the mat, I sought guidance from my Number 3, **Bob Dunlop**, who asked me to switch to a draw on the back-hand to rest on the opponent's bowl in the hope of gaining the extra shot. The tactic worked and we got the winning shot. This experience illustrates two important points in the game of bowls:

1. Skips should take note of guidance offered by Number Threes

No matter how badly you start a match, with good teamwork, you can still 2.


Publication under pressure
