### Gardening Group news





## Coloured shirts

#### The end of the search is in sight!

Following exhaustive (and exhausting!) efforts to find a supplier of bespoke coloured shirts, following agreement on an acceptable design, the Men's Executive Committee have finally approved an order for 50 shirts. Sadly - and surprisingly - no local supplier could be found. Through current **LBA** President. *Terry Whiteside*, an order has been placed with a Chinese company!

As a result of a canvass of Members, conducted by Men's Club Secretary, **Rob Wilbourn**, iust over 30 Members (Men and Ladies combined) have already agreed to order these shirts and have supplied details of sizes. In order to meet the minimum order requirement at the unit price quoted, it has been agreed that "spare" shirts in a range of sizes should be ordered. The new design incorporates the Men's badge but does not feature individual player names.

Shirts will therefore be available for anyone who decides later that he/she would like to purchase one or who is recruited to play in League matches on an occasional basis.

Unfortunately, without incurring significant extra cost for air freight, there will be an 8-10 weeks delivery period following the manufacturer's receipt of the confirmed order. Shirts cannot therefore be expected before mid-July at the earliest.

While the Executive Committee are anxious to implement the decision taken at the AGM, that coloured shirts should be worn for all League fixtures, they have been obliged to agree to defer implementation until the order has been fulfilled. In the meantime, it has been decided that white shirt and Club tie should be required Dress Code for all League games. Special thanks are due to **Pete Murray** and **Rob Wilbourn** for all of the efforts they have put in to solving this difficult issue in the months since the AGM.

And what a sorry reflection on British manufacturers that we could find no-one to take our business!

# Grant award for disabled access ramp

#### Formal approval from Council to proceed expected shortly

THE CLUB has been awarded a grant of £2000, from the Derbyshire Landfill Trust, towards the cost of the installation of an ashphalt ramp between the clubhouse and the green with gently sloping "shoulders" to minimise inconvenience to pedestrian traffic across the Park between Melton Road and St Peter's Street.

Club Chairman, Colin Grimes, says: "The Derbyshire Environmental Trust has strong links with Lafarge Aggregates, based in Syston, who originally suggested the Trust as a possible source of financial assistance.

Formal approval from the Syston Town Council for the work to proceed is expected shortly. The ramp, which will facilitate disabled access to the clubhouse and green from all directions, should be in place well before the end of the Season. Special thanks are due to Club Director, George Dodge, for his efforts on this important project.

This month, Des looks to the subject of etiquette



- **DURING** the measuring process, Leads and Seconds should allow the Number Threes plenty of room and be ready to offer assistance with measuring equipment, if required and requested. Although agreement on the score is a matter solely for the Number Threes, others should not hesitate to (politely) draw the attention of a Number Three to what might be a scoring wood.
- If your opponent plays a poor or unlucky shot, do not show any outward sign of satisfaction at the misfortune. It could be your turn next!
- 3. Don't hesitate to applaud/praise a good | 7. After the game, remain in uniform while shot - whoever plays it.
- 4. Keep conversation to a minimum while the mat is occupied. Chatter serves only to break a player's concentration and spoil delivery.
- **5.** Any conversation should be confined to players within your own rink. Engaging players on other rinks or speaking too loudly to those on your own rink - can be particularly disturbing and annoying to 9. others.
- **6.** Simple courtesies on the green should be extended towards others in the clubhouse both before and after the game.

# Club looks to possible TV promotion!

A proposal has been submitted to **London ITV** for the Club to participate in a special programme showcasing a wide range of sports from abseiling to yachting (*Can you name a sport beginning with "z"?*) The idea is that each sport, within the limits of a 90 seconds video, has the opportunity to show a studio audience what it has to offer and what makes it special. Very much on the lines of programmes like "*The X Factor*", the audience votes for the sport which has done most to impress.

A prize of £100,000 will be awarded to the eventual winner!

While it would be wildly optimistic to believe that bowling could compete with more visually exciting and thrilling sports (*think of trampolining, skateboarding or paragliding*) any TV exposure would be a great bonus for the sport, in general, and for our Club in particular. One concept under consideration is to highlight the last two woods to be delivered in the (*fictional*) Club Mixed Triples competition. The introduction will make it clear that after successfully battling through preliminary rounds, the two teams are level after 17 ends with the Skips to deliver their final woods. In the video we see Skip A (a Lady) deliver a wood which takes shot. Skip B (either *Mike Foster* from the wheelchair or *Kieran Jordan*) delivers the final wood which edges in to take the match and the Championship. Of course by careful editing, the apparent accuracy of each shot can be "fixed" for visual effect.

The whole "message" of the piece is to show how bowls is truly a sport for all where men, women, young, old and disabled can compete on equal terms. The six "stars" of the show will represent that mix.

Of course, our application to participate has yet to be accepted but, in the course of several telephone conversations with the programme Producer, our proposal appears to have been very favourably received.

If we are accepted, filming will take place in June.

THESE figures are intended to inform everyone about the facts of the current situation.

As explained at the Club AGM, we need to look at ways in which we can relate membership fees more directly to the core Club activity of bowling, to reduce our dependence on non-bowling revenues, to establish a fair

and equitable fee structure which reflects actual usage of the green and clubhouse facilities and, at the same time, enables us to re-build modest cash reserves to put us in a position to meet any future need for repairs, maintenance or other Club development that might present itself.

All options are open for discussion by all Members.

Any ideas or suggestions should initially be put to your Section Committee where further discussion will identify well-supported proposals that can be put to the Board in time for 2013 policy to be decided. One suggestion already made is that with effect from 2013 **a** green fee of .50p per match (Home & Away) should be charged in addition to the annual membership subscription set at the time. For simplicity of accounting, the Men's Section would be billed in advance for £1250 and the Ladies for £250 leaving them to collect and recoup the funds through green fees per player/match throughout the Season.

Roll-ups and competitions would, presumably, be exempt from this arrangement which would apply to recognised fixtures only.
