The Club coach column

This month, Des advises on pre-match temperament and preparation



THE first essential when embarking on a competitive match is to make sure that you are in control of your "nerves". To this end, it is a good plan always to be on the green well before the game is due to start.

If your concentration wanders, your play will deteriorate. Your drop in performance induces a further lessening of confidence and nervous and physical stresses arise. The consequence is that you suffer a "bad patch". At this point you will continue dismally to defeat or make a positive effort to recover and proceed to a well-deserved victory.

Never let your head drop and lose all interest in the game. There are few situations in bowls which can be regarded as truly hopeless.

To recover from a "bad patch", your priority should be to restore a sense of physical relaxation before moving on to remedy the cause of your drop in performance through concentration. Take deep breaths. Pause to settle yourself when you stand on the mat. Take your time to rehearse your shot fully in your mind's eye before attempting your delivery. Only thus will your confidence return and this confidence can readily act as an inspiration for the remainder of the game.

The delivery of a wood is a delicate operation, calling for a relaxed and free flowing action. Without these attributes, consistently accurate bowling is impossible.

Confidence, concentration and control, these three, but the greatest of these is control, on which the other two so largely depend.

One of the virtues and attractions that can be attributed to bowls is that it teaches self-control and, by and large, this is a major reason why it is such a companionable game based on the spirit of friendliness.

It has been said that to win modestly and to lose with grace are the marks of a good sportsman. And so, indeed they are. But they are also the result of years of self-control!
