IN many ways Number 2 is complementary to the Lead and, as such, has the task of rectifying what the Lead may have failed to achieve or to balance and improve upon a promising position. The Number 2 has to be a good, close drawing player and, primarily, a good length player - with the ability to play a fast wood if needed. The Lead has to try to be exact but, with the Number 2, it is often less important - although a Skip will want him/her to be closely involved in the head.

### Number 3

The ideal Number 3 has to be capable of measure. delivering a variety of shots and will be Two additional points for a Number 3 to asked, perhaps more than any other player, to play such shots as the block, a position wood and/or a jack trailing shot. Such shots are never easy, so the Number 3 has to be a good "weight" player.

Number 3 is the right hand and second in command to the Skip keeping the Skip fully informed of the current situation in the head, making sure that the Skip hasn't missed anything by posing the appropriate questions.

Although I personally like to involve the Lead and Number 2 in any discussions on tactics, it is the Number 3 who carries the responsibility of passing advice to the Skip. There is one failing that a Number 3 must quard against. It is amazing how often I have witnessed a Number 3 leap in with a suggestion for a shot just as the Skip is about to send down his first wood - often with disastrous consequences. Remember, the Skip has just left the head, having analysed the situation, and decided on what shot to play. Any suggestions from Number 3 should be made while they are both at the head. A Skip should never be interrupted when on the mat about to play his shot of choice. If the situation in the head has changed after the Skips' first deliveries,


