SUCCESSFUL CHALLENGE TO "SENSELESS" & "ILLEGAL" BAN

Making a mountain out of a molehill (or ramp).

The issues leading to the locking and unlocking - of the Park gates.

In seeking to justify their ban on all vehicular access to Central Park following the installation of a disabled ramp running between the clubhouse and green, the Town Council argued that the installation was illegal and, in any case, represented a serious risk to public safety! The decision by the full Council, at their meeting on 25th March was taken in spite of assurances from the Club that the access ramp. which had been designed and installed by the County Council Highways Department with full planning permission from Charnwood Borough Council, is fully covered by the Club's public liability insurance. and the Club has a legal obligation to provide disabled access to its facilities.

At the subsequent meeting of the Development Committee held on 1st April, Club Chairman, Colin Grimes, in a powerful speech, reemphasising the points he had already made in a letter to the Council, pointed out that without

access, it would be impossible to maintain the green and the future survival of the Club was thereby threatened. While accepting that the Council had been right to raise the issue of safety, he claimed that they had no rights unilaterally to denv vehicle access for the purposes of servicing the clubhouse and green a right enshrined in the Club's lease agreement. He described the ban as "senseless, illegal and invalid". He argued that continued lack of access, caused by changing the locks on the Melton Road gates and withholding a spare key from the Club. would also cause the Club to be in breach of its obligations under planning law and building regulations, which require the Club to ensure adequate means of access to the emergency services at all times while the clubhouse is in use. He said: "It is clear to us that the installation of the ramp has been used as an excuse to attempt to manipulate the Council into a complete ban on vehicles in the Park which has been the long-time declared aim of an unrepresentative minority within our community".

At the conclusion of an extended debate, witnessed by a packed public gallery, comprised of Club Members and others, during which the Club's position received especially strong support from Councillors Lilley and Vardy, it was eventually agreed that, provided the we delivered a copy of the Club's public liability insurance cover certificate and a copy of the Licence issued by the County Council, we should be supplied with a key for the Melton Road gate to permit resumption of our normal activities.

In spite of an overnight/early morning attempt to overturn the Committee's decision, with the approval of the Chairman of Council, the key was eventually handed over and the Park gates were re-opened at 2 p.m. on Wednesday 2nd April.

The County Council have subsequently issued a statement saying "It is the County Council's view that, as the ramp does not physically impose on the Village Green itself, notwithstanding that its construction constitutes works for which the consent of the Secretary of State is, strictly speaking, required, the ramp has otherwise been constructed lawfully and in accordance with a Licence granted by the County Council and is of benefit to the public."

Power of Positive Thinking

In competitions a player may be prepared

physically, but still susceptible to the most crippling of conditions - self-doubt!

Putting it simply, if a player has any doubts in his performance, he won't perform. Handling pressure is also absolutely crucial in a player's performance. The number one issue we encounter is around confidence.

Stress manifests itself in many ways, but we pay particular attention to to what is contributing to the lack os concentration. To concentrate is to be clear of other thoughts, as too much talking, as I have said before, when you pick up your bowl, that should be the start of your concentration.

Anyone who has watched bowling on the TV, if one of the bowler's are about to bowl and they are distracted by someone, they sometimes changed their bowl and pick up another one, so they begin their concentration again.

When playing in a match and you start playing badly, the more you try the harder it gets for you, then you start thinking it is one of those days, and you will not play any better and can't wait for the 21st end and the finish of the match!

This is where the 'Power of Positive Thinking' comes in.

Firstly, clear your mind that it is one of those days and that you can't play any better.

Relax and forget the bad bowls, look forward to the next end for your first good bowl. which will come if you think back to basics. Relax and be positive that you can come into your normal game, to feel you can cope with the pressure and still put in a good performance up to the 21st end.

Your first good bowl could start you getting your confidence back and concentrate on that smooth delivery.

When I first started playing bowls, I used to think it was just one of those days when I played badly.

With the years of experience playing bowls, I still can start playing badly, but I can still finish a match playing well up to the 2st end, win or lose.

So always be positive when playing bowls, you will have bad bowls so don't worry about them, you will have the next end to improve your game.

PS: At the start of the outdoor season and playing on heavy greens, if the lead and number 2 are the first to get a bowl on the Jack, then they give their rink the advantage of winning the end.

A NEW BREAK-THROUGH FOR BOWLERS

According to a well known bowling magazine, a bowls manufacturer, also well known, are experimenting with a project that will help all bowlers to be more accurate when bowling to the head.

Although this project is in the early stages of development it is claimed that the days of sending down a heavy bowl or for that matter a bowl that is too short, will be a thing of the past.

In a leaked memo the device will be a small disc that will be inserted into the bowl so that it will be flush with the side of the bowl.

On the disc will be a dial with metric measurements on it, that can be set to the approximate distance that the bowl is required to travel.

The manufacturer realises that nearly all bowlers have their own bowls so they will either convert your bowls for you at at a modest price or one will be able to go to an approved bowls retailer near you.

If this device is approved by the EBA and the EIBA then it could be on the market later in the year.

Watch this space for more information as and when it is released!

For the more enquiring mind the disc is using the latest Gyro Internal Technology (GIT) which contains micro gears, which in turn controls the friction of the bowl's surface on whatever surface it is being bowled on.
