BOWLS LINGO

- Backhand | When (for a right-handed player) the bowl is delivered so the curve of the bowl is from the left to right.
- · Bias | The shape of the bowl which causes it to curve.
- · Delivery | The moment the bowl leaves the hand.
- Ditch | The gully around the green. If a bowl ends up in the ditch and it is not a 'toucher' then it doesn't count.
- Draw | A bowl delivered at the correct weight, and with correct line, to arrive exactly where you want.
- End | The sequence of play from the moment the mat is placed down until all bowls
 have been delivered and you know who has won. A bit like a game in tennis!
- · Foot fault | If you don't deliver the bowl with part of your foot on or above the mat.
- Forehand | When (for the right-handed player) the bowl is delivered so that the curve
 of the bowl is from the right to left.
- · Green | The total playing area. There are usually 6 rinks on each green.
- Jack | The little round target ball to which you're trying to get your bowls closest.
- Mat | The rectangular shaped mat from which the bowler must deliver the jack and/or bowl.
- Pace of Weight | The amount of force with which the bowl is delivered to execute a
 particular shot.
- Rink | The rectangular strip of the green, between 4 and 6 metres wide, on which the game takes place.

Stance | Position adopted on the mat prior to delivery.

Shot | The bowl that is nearest the jack at any stage of play.

Toucher | A bowl that hits the jack during its original course. This bowl still counts ever if it ends up in the ditch.

ETIQUETTE – This is an area that members need to be aware of.

We are a sport with a long tradition of sporting behaviour.

New bowlers are invariably either left to find out for themselves what is expected of them, or they find themselves confronted by another bowler who delights in telling them what they are allowed and not allowed to do. This latter approach can be very disconcerting and in our club we want every new bowler to feel welcome in a friendly environment. Remember to treat people how you wish to be treated.

- Each bowler during a game is expected to be ready to bowl when it is their turn and to concentrate on the match. In competitive matches save your socialising for afterwards.
- 2. Players are expected to be quiet and not move at the head end when a player is preparing to bowl.
- Remain behind the mat (1m) & do not do anything to distract your opponent.
- Always remember that, as soon as your bowl has come to rest, possession of the rink (at both ends)
 passes to your opponent.
- 5. Avoid obscuring the rink number and rink markers from the bowler.
- Be aware of players on adjacent rinks.
- Keep to your own rink and do not become a wanderer and distract other bowlers.
- Do not walk past the end of a rink when somebody is about to bowl towards you. Spectators please also be aware.
- Encourage and praise the rest of the team including the skip. Bowls is a team game, everyone should be working together.
 - 0. Don't applaud a team member who has outrageous luck and admit a fluke shot with grace.
- 11. Compliment your opponents' bowls and don't wave your opponents' bowls through the head.
- Never criticise your opponents, the green or your own team. If you cannot say anything positive, do not say anything at all.
- 13. Minimise the distraction and interference with bowlers on adjacent rinks during movement between ends by walking, as far as possible, along the centre of the rink.
- Be gracious whether you win or lose.
- 15. At the end of the game shake hands with your opposition.
- 16. In a singles game thank the marker and offer to buy them, as well as your opposition, a drink.
- 17. After matches be prepared to offer your opposition a drink and socialise with them.
- 8. All members are recommended to read the Laws of Bowls to familiarise themselves with the laws governing the sport. This is particularly important when playing at national level.


